COURSE DESCRIPTION

The First Mexican-American Congress of Clinical Immunology and Allergy has been organized to provide an exchange of the latest scientific information of interest and value to practicing clinicians and clinical scientists in the USA and Latin America. It is also a demonstration program of the feasibility of a joint meeting crossing an international border that has, in the past, been a major impediment to scientific and medical exchange.

Outstanding basic and clinical scientists will speak on themes including the Biological Basis of Immunologic Diseases and Allergic Diseases with topics including: Nutrition, the Complement System, T & B Cell Regulation, Tolerance, Genetic Regulation, Transfer Factor, Leukocyte Defects and Tumor Immunology. Clinical scientists will present their studies on asthma, immune deficiency diseases, infectious diseases, allergic rhinitis and immunotherapy.

Contributed abstracts and posters will be selected for presentation and discussion during the Congress.

This Congress is a joint effort of the University of California in San Diego and the Autonoma University in Tijuana with endorsement of both Latin American and USA Societies.
